

Youth castle Jomsburg

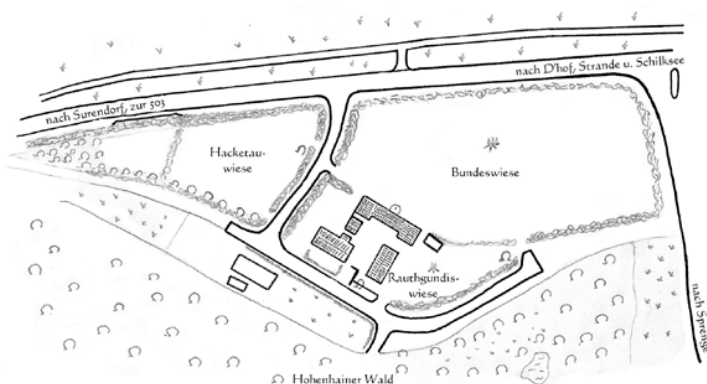


Hello!

You have expressed interest in taking a trip to Jomsburg with your group. So that you can get a better impression of the castle, we would like to give you this Introduction to Jomsburg and the surrounding area in more detail.

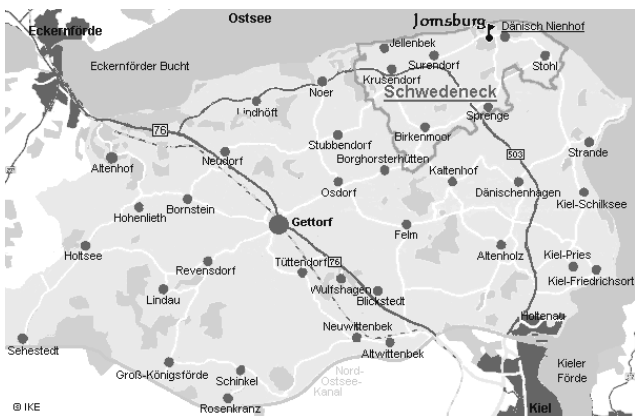
About Jomsburg and Dänisch-Nienhof

The Jomsburg was built between 1975 and 1988 by our association's scouts themselves. The heart of the Jomsburg are the two 10m high towers, which are connected to a long battlement. The castle, including the outbuildings that include the castle courtyard, has a hall (the Remter) for around 50 people, a large attic bedroom (pirate bunk) and two large sanitary rooms. A fully equipped kitchen with a gas stove is available for cooking. Next to this there is a small dining room with a cozy Buller stove. The Jomsburg also has a few group rooms for the clans of our association and the apartment of our castle bailiff. Of course, the castle also includes various meadows: our federal meadow with approx. 1ha, the Hacketau-meadow with approx. 500m² and the Rauthgundis-meadow with approx. 200m². In total the site covers approximately 2ha.



Jomsburg is located near the town of Dänisch-Nienhof at the tip of the peninsula “Dänischer Woldh” between the Kiel Fjord and the Eckernförde Bay. The castle is located on the edge of a private forest ('Hohenhainer Wald', which unfortunately can only be entered on the paths!!) and approx. 300m as the crow flies from the beach on the Baltic Sea. From your towers you can see Denmark when the visibility is good.

Dänisch-Nienhof is a Baltic Sea resort with a 25 m high cliff and a beautiful sandy beach. The surrounding area is a glacial moraine and hilly landscape typical of Schleswig-Holstein's Baltic Sea coast with small patches of forest, moor areas, ancient barrows, as well as the so-called Knicks - wall hedges to delimit fields and fields



From Eckernförde and Kiel you can reach the Danish island world comfortably and inexpensively by boat. In addition to Kiel (Molfsee open-air museum, Laboe memorial, shipping museum, ...) and Eckernförde (wave pool), other destinations are of course Schleswig and the Viking town of Haithabu with its museums (Gottorf Castle, where, among other things, bog bodies are exhibited). There is a regular bus connection to and from Kiel, but for larger groups it is advisable to bring a car.

After your binding registration using the registration form, you will receive a booking confirmation and (for larger groups/many nights) an advance invoice for 30% of the expected final total. After your stay you will receive an invoice for each person.

What else is there to know?

- Castle bailiff Our castle bailiff Heiko will be happy to answer any questions you may have during your stay. He will also greet you after your arrival and introduce you. Please let Heiko know the exact time of your arrival at least 1 week before your trip (telephone 0176 64494489) so that he can be present. Before you leave, the castle steward will inspect the castle and the meadows. He exercises house rule at our castle.
- Castle kitchen There is a large gas oven with 8 burners and several refrigerators as well as crockery and cutlery for around 50 people. Pots and other cooking utensils can be borrowed by arrangement.
- Refrigerators Refrigerators are available to all guest groups, even if they have not booked the kitchen.
- Beer tent sets You are welcome to rent beer tent sets from us. Cost per set: €15 per week
- Wood for building tents. There is enough wood for building tents. It must not be sawn into pieces. If you need lumber, we can give you an address.
- Fireplaces There is a fireplace on all meadows. If you would like to build additional fires, please bring fire bowls with you.
- Firewood You can purchase coarse firewood from us at cost price. We charge €10 per wheelbarrow. You have to do the chopping yourself.
- Clay oven After registering or in consultation with the castle bailiff, you are welcome to use our clay oven for bread or pizza and borrow the accessories. You can find baking instructions to download on our website.
- Herb spiral You are welcome to use the herbs in our herb spiral if you pull out some weeds in return.
- Bring with you Please bring your own cleaning supplies (green soap), toilet paper and other consumables, as well as saws and hatchets or axes for firewood. There are enough foam mattresses available in the pirate bunk and the other sleeping quarters. **If you want to use these, please also bring fitted sheets.**
- Coast and beach Scouts who identify themselves through their neckerchief enjoy the privilege of not having any to pay tourist tax outside the beach chair area!
- Excursions Upon request, you will receive an information folder from our castle steward with brochures for all leisure and excursion options in the area for you to view. He also has copies of many brochures to give away.

- by bicycle

From Kiel main station you drive towards Schilksee-Olympiazentrum. After you have crossed the Kiel Canal, you either take the well-developed cycle path along the B 503 towards Eckernförde to Surendorf, then about 2km to Dänisch-Nienhof or you ride on the Fördestraße via Schilksee and Stohl to Dänisch-Nienhof. Nienhof.

- on foot

From Kiel main station you can take the European long-distance hiking trail No.1. This leads via Friedrichsort, Schilksee and Strande, always along the beach or the cliffs to Dänisch-Nienhof. We recommend that you first take the bus to Strande (lines 501, 502, 901) or Schilksee (lines 501, 502). What's even more interesting is taking a ride on a fjord steamer that takes you directly from the main train station to Schilksee or Strande. From Schilksee or Strande you always walk along the cliffs until you come to the "Seeschlößchen" beach café. Here you turn left and right again at the main road, 500m away - straight ahead for 5 minutes and you will see the castle. The whole hike takes between 2 and 3 hours and is absolutely recommended!

- by bus

From Kiel main station (the stop - not the central bus station - is directly opposite) take a bus on line 900/901 of the Kieler Verkehrsverbund in the direction of Krusendorf or Surendorf. It stops in Dänisch-Nienhof directly in front of Jomsburg. The stop is called "Lindenweg".

- Car

From the A215 motorway, shortly before Kiel, take the exit 8 - "Kiel Mitte" onto the B76 (later B503) towards Schilksee/Olympiazentrum. You always stay on this road until the Surendorf exit. Turn right after the exit, then it goes about 2km to Dänisch-Nienhof.

- Airplane

You get off the plane at Kiel/Holtenau Airport. It's best to take yourself from there
Taxi that will take you directly to the castle.
